Change is coming to East Fulton Street! The Library recently acquired the vacant lot on the east side of the old Probation building and that space will be undergoing a transformation over the next few months. The street end of the property will be developed into an auxiliary parking lot -- something we've needed for years. The back end of the property will be cultivated into a green space, to be used for outdoor programing in the warmer months -- something we've wanted for years. The project will be broken down into two phases: the first to be completed this fall, and the second to be completed in 2024. For the most part, services and programming will continue as usual while the property is under construction, with little to no inconvenience for our patrons. We hope you share in our excitement and are as eager to use this new space as we are.

Library Cards

Getting a library card is easy and free. GPL has two kinds:

Traditional Card: Our full-service card for residents in our service area. Those ages 18+ can sign themselves up by presenting a photo ID and a piece of addressed mail or check. Children and teens must have a parent/guardian present, with the above required items.

Core Card: Our limited-service card for those who aren't eligible for a traditional card. Those age 18+ can sign themselves up at the Library. Children and teens must have an adult present to get a card. Core cards do not require documentation.


Acceptable donations for adults, teens and kids, include: hardcover and paperback fiction, nonfiction, biographies, picture books, coffee table books, and art books.


